Dr. Jacqueline Jordan Irvine reviews 50 years since Brown decision

"Still Standing in the Schoolhouse Doors," was the title of the keynote address delivered by Dr. Jacqueline Jordan Irvine of Emory University. While relating the theme to the Supreme Court decision, Brown vs. the Board of Education, Dr. Irvine also connected the theme to the current "No Child Left Behind" initiative.

"The most effective teachers are found in schools where they are needed the least," Dr. Irvine told participants, noting that the two challenges must be faced. They include convincing policy makers to act on behalf of other people's children, and that we "will not and cannot achieve our vision with children with broken promises and broken dreams," she said.

A prolific author in the field of education, Dr. Irvine specializes in multicultural education and urban teacher education.

She has received numerous awards, including the Distinguished Career Award from the Special Interest Group on Black Education of the American Education Research Association, and the Thomas Jefferson award, the highest award given to an Emory University faculty member for service and research.

Submission Guidelines:

- **1.** Each submission should include a separate title page. The title page should include:
 - a. title of the submission,
 - b. topic area of the submission (see above list),
 - c. format of the presentation (see above list),
 - d. name(s) of the author(s),
 - e. department(s) and affiliation(s),
 - f. mailing address(es),
 - g. e-mail address(es),
 - h. phone number(s),
 - i. fax number(s),
 - j. corresponding author if different than lead author.

Correspondence regarding receipt of submission will be made by e-mail unless otherwise requested. If an early acceptance is needed for visa or budgetary reasons, please include that information.

2. Submissions may be made via e-mail, by fax or mail. E-mail submissions to the address below are preferred. Submissions will be acknowledged within 48 hours. For mailed submissions, provide two copies of your paper, report, abstract, or study. Submissions imply that at least one author will register for the conference and present at the time designated in the program. Submissions must be received by September 8, 2004. There is a limit of two papers per lead author.

- **3.** Submissions will only be published in the conference proceedings if at least one of the authors attends the conference. Instructions for submitting a computer readable format will be provided at the time the paper is accepted.
- 4. If you wish to be a reviewer or session chair, please e-mail your request to the above address and indicate the topic area in which you are interested. Registration for the conference is required to be a session chair. W

Format of Presentations:

Paper sessions

Up to four papers are presented in a 90 minute session, giving each presenter **20 to 30 minutes** to share their research topic *and* field questions and comments.

Workshop Sessions

Workshop presenters have 90 minutes to share their research topic *and* field questions and comments.

Panel Sessions

Panel presenters collectively have 90 minutes to present the topic *and* field questions and comments, with a mutual arrangement as to how that time is split among panelists.

Poster Sessions

These 90-minute sessions consist of a large number presentations in an exhibition format. Poster sessions allow attendees to speak with the presenters on a one-to-one basis. If you are scheduled for a poster session, the following supplies will be provided to present your research on:

- Easel
- Tri-fold display board (48 x 36 inches)
- Markers
- Push pins
- Tape
- Round table
- Chairs
